And of course, we did have our share of fun while working on it!



A few of our students who portrayed the media, captured the series of events with their wonderful artwork and articles thus adding a dimension of spice and authenticity to the programme.



Mathletics-a celebratory programme organised by the IB section was conducted on the 22nd of December, 2020. During the event, students participated in a plethora of activities, organised only after prudent planning and constructive forethought. Specifically designed, to acknowledge the importance of the use of mathematics in daily life, participants took part in events such as, **debates and quizzes**- which were based on learning and application of mathematical knowledge and concepts. Via the online platform, the event reinforced the significance of mathematics through enjoyable activities.

The event's prelude was the debate, conducted in a rather unique way. All the participants, divided into groups, were to speak for or against the motion- "Intuition helps in making

mathematical assumptions.". It was fascinating to witness how, many of the participants proffering the motion, included examples of Tenali Rama and Shakuntala Devi as evidence for their arguments. It was even more amusing to watch the rebuttal round, where one of the most judicious points, regarding the connection between "Math and Intuition" were put forth.

Participants were finally awarded points based on the collective criteria of organization, clarity, use of



arguments, use of crossexamination and rebuttal and their cooperation skills.

A quiz is a mind sport. It's a test of how much factual knowledge one wields, and this was exactly the purpose of "Mathopedia". Often, while learning maths, we start mugging up patterns, instead of learning the essence of the concept. We become better at recognising patterns, more than reasoning, critically assessing and solving problems. This quiz put these skills of the quiz

The quiz was followed by a very informational yet humorous **skit**, narrating vignettes of daily life where concepts of math are heavily availed. The splendid fifteen minute skit lightened the mood of the audience. It served as a comic relief that deflated the anxiousness of the participants, who were exhausted after the quiz. Personally, as a part of the cast of the skit myself, I

had witnessed the planning and hard work that the organisers had poured into the skit. It was truly a valuable experience both for me and the audience.

An amazing juxtaposition of formal and informal methods of attaining knowledge, it was indeed a splendid event. The event laid emphasis on the importance of realising the significance of mathematics in the modern world and I thoroughly enjoyed it. 
TOK CONFERENCE

Knowledge is described as familiarity, awareness, or comprehension of someone or things, such as information, abilities, or things. It is, as defined by Plato, a justified, sincere conviction. This is where TOK, or Theory of Knowledge, comes into play. The Theory of Knowledge, which is a central component of the IB curriculum, examines the origins and complexities of acquiring and disseminating knowledge and intelligence, and the TOK Conference 2021 was a meager effort to shed some light on the topics of quality of information and beliefs. It was to understand how knowledge and information get altered as they pass through many obstacles before reaching us.

Est Artifex:





Bona Fide:

This group of enthusiastic TOK learners inquired as "To what extent is faith necessary for the production and acceptance of knowledge?" One side argued that faith is a basic requirement for creating and accepting understanding, citing religious scriptures such as the Bhagavad Gita as well as claims from monks and priests to support their assertion. This claim was countered with the claim that religious faith lacks a coherent and fundamental implementation and has no logical justification.

It was backed up by facts from the behaviourism hypothesis, which states that because behaviour is what we can see, it is what needs to be evaluated. Before concluding the discussion, the committee gave the crowd some food for contemplation with the following conclusion: If knowledge is a map, you might imply that religion is mapping a rather different territory than, say, natural sciences.





A Voce Magna:

was an enthralling group of students who debated whether the more influential voices can influence the truth we know and experience on a daily basis. Each presentation was meticulously planned to ensure audience participation while still being educational. They cited Donald Trump, Adolf Hitler, and Elon Musk as examples to support the prompt in question. As a whole, the presentation was extremely stimulating, resulting in fruitful discussions and providing food for thought for all participants.

TOK is about examining all viewpoints and arriving at the least skewed conclusion. In this event, the student groups attempted to indulge in a discourse that took note of all the possible perspectives. Bias is unavoidable and is a part of human nature, but the students hope that considering diverse points of view has aided in eliminating or at least controlling bias from sneaking into our judgement.

Infenestra:

The question posed by the "In Fenestra" group was: "How can what we see be constrained by what we cannot see?" They attempted to respond in the same way by presenting some beautiful and factually correct examples. They presented a video which explored Human Sciences, the origins of the Hubble Space Telescope and Aurora lights on Earth and Saturn. The students were then guided to an imaginative and cartoonish video highlighting Magnes' discovery of Magnets, as well as a series of wonderful, infographic slides on Mathematics.

Eventually, they came across the subject that proved to be the turning point of the entire event:

What qualifies as art? This question prompted many participants to express their thoughts/perspectives/points of view on the topic.



Republic day car rally






The event finally came to an end.




To make our own lives meaningful and worth living, this conscious presence of one in one 's

On Friday, April 9th, 2021,
Buckingham Palace announced
the passing of His Royal
Highness The Prince Phillip,
Duke of Edinburgh at the age
of 99. He served as the Queen's
consort since 1952 and
her husband for 73 years.

The Duke was a very important character in the House of Windsor and played a pivotal role in shaping the Royal Family in the way we see them today. He was a man who had a pragmatic approach to life which can be connected back to his early years.

Prince Philip of Greece and Denmark was born on the 10th of June, 1921 in Corfu, Greece to Princess Alice of Battenburg and Prince Andrew


of Greece and Denmark. He was technically a great-great grandchild of Queen Victoria just like his future wife. After a coup in Greece forced him to flee Greece in an orange crate. People believe that because Phillip was a Royal, arguably more Royal blooded than the Queen, he lived a life of privilege when in reality, it was far from that. His father fled to the South of France and his mother was admitted to a sanatorium. His sisters married into German royalty and were wives of prominent Nazis and a young Phillip lived a hard childhood, hopping around Europe, in pursuit of his education. He had little contact with his mother

during these years and he lost his sister,

Cecile in a plane crash in Belgium when
he was 16. Philip ended up at Gordonstoun
School in Scotland where he adopted his
values of hard-work, discipline and
achievement. Phillip's naval

career began at Britannia Royal Naval College at Dartmouth and he served in the Royal Navy during the Second World War and served on various battleships including **HMS Ramillies, HMS Kent and HMS Shropshire.** During the Battle of Cape Matapan, he was mentioned in the dispatches while serving on HMS Valiant as a searchlight operator. He was also awarded the Greek War Cross. In 1942, he was promoted to Lieutenant and was the First Lieutenant of HMS Wallace at the age of 21,

one of the youngest in the Royal Navy. In 1943, he saved HMS Wallace from a night



which allowed the vessel to escape unnoticed. He also captained HMS Magpie in 1950, the only vessel he would captain before leaving the Royal Navy.

In 1952, King George VI passed away which meant that he would take up the role of the Consort of the Monarch upon the ascension of Elizabeth as the Sovereign. This would effectively end his career in the navy and he would dedicate his life to serving the Monarch.

The Duke of Edinburgh was a modernist and brought a new wave of change in the Royal household. As the Chairman of the Coronation Commission, in order to make the ceremony more egalitarian, he put forward the idea of televising it. He was involved in over 700 charitable organisations. One of his greatest charitable works was the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme which provided millions of kids a chance to develop valuable skills, irrespective of their backgrounds in numerous countries around the world. The Duke was an environmentalist and was the first President of the World Wildlife Fund. He was also a keen sportsman and was the President of the Marylebone Cricket Club, International Equestrian Federation and the National Playing Fields Association to name a few.

In his personal life, the Duke was a father, a grandfather and a great-grandfather.

His eldest son, Prince Charles said

upon his death "My dear Papa, was a very special person..." and his youngest son Prince Edward once said that

whenever one had the privilege of listening to him, his humour always shone through. The late Diana, Princess of Wales addressed him as "Dearest Pa" and he walked with his grandsons, Prince William and Prince Harry behind her coffin during the funeral.

Prince Phillip was a man who had no filter and a man who always spoke his mind, even behind the scenes. His no-nonsense, pragmatic attitude towards life was something which shaped the way he carried himself and something which also got him into a bit of trouble through his gaffes. The Duke was a man who devoted his life in serving Britain and the Commonwealth. He sacrificed his distinguished career in the

navy to walk two steps behind his wife, to raise a family and to serve the Sovereign and her subjects. He retired from Royal duties in 2017 after conducting 22,191 engagements and giving 5,493 speeches.

He leaves behind a deep void in the lives of not only the Royal Family and the British but for millions across the Commonwealth and the world, whose lives he touched in his decades of service and charitable work. Her Majesty has lost her "Strength and Stay" of more than seven decades, someone who remained her steadfast companion through thick and thin.

Biden's First Days

West Wing.




The Coronavirus Pandemic has been the priority of every government in the world in the past year and Biden promised 100 million vaccines in 100 days and so far he has exceeded that promise as the US has delivered a total of 235 million doses.





Immigration was one of the prime taking points of the previous administration and especially with regards to the Southern border with Mexico. Biden claimed that most of the undocumented people in the US came into the country legally but have overstayed the visas but he has faced criticism over the recent surge in illegal immigration from Mexico. He justified this by claiming that there are periodic fluctuations in migration over the border and the recent increase is commonplace in the winter months of January, February and March.

When it comes to **economic** recovery, Biden signed a \$1.9 trillion American rescue plan aimed to bring relief to 85% of Americans by providing them with a stimulus check. This was targeted to aid small businesses and funding to reopen schools. The Congress also approved another one of Biden's promises, the **American Rescue Plan**. This plan entails some key changes such as increasing the federal minimum wage to 15 dollars and trimming the federal boost to unemployment benefits. The President has also used his executive powers to expand food assistance and the suspension of federal student loan payments and interest charges.





In these dire times of the pandemic, Biden has strengthened the **Affordable Care Act** which provided uninsured time till mid-August 2021 to sign up for coverage along with increasing subsidies for existing enrollees to shop for better plans.

The 46th President inherited the Oval Office with some rather tricky diplomatic situations in hand. The relationship with **China** has been one of the focal points of foreign policy affairs for the United States and Biden has surprisingly continued the strong stance from the Trump administration. He also announced that the United States will withdraw its troops from Afghanistan before the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks.

Finally, Biden hosted one of his promised global climate change summits where he committed the US to reducing its greenhouse gas emissions by 50% below its 2005

emissions by 2030, though he has not revealed the plans to execute this goal. On his first day in the office, he reversed Donald Trump's 2017 decision to withdraw from the Paris Climate Accords through an executive order and the US finally rejoined the deal in February after a 30 day review.




It has been some rather eventful 100 days in the West Wing with actions taken in an array of fields but only time will tell how well they are executed and the fruits they bear.

THE SUEZ CANAL

The Suez Canal, a waterway financed by both French and Egyptian governments, that enabled travel between the Mediterranean Sea and the Indian Ocean by the means of the Red Sea, has been a source of grave conflict between the superpowers since its inauguration.

World trade is the labyrinth that commands and connects countries. By coaxing competition, global prices plummet, creating an **inverse** relationship that maintains balance and is mutually beneficial to the parties involved. It also utilizes each nation's unique economic specialisation, thus sustaining the 'free market system'. Egypt, the land

system.' Egypt, the land of the Nile, was the first country to dig a canal across its

commerce and globe-trotting.

The canal was launched in 1869 and was made accessible to maritime vessels from all nations, without prejudice, in peace and in war, under the provisions of an international treaty negotiated in 1888, The Convention of Constantinople. Even so, Britain considered the canal to be critical to the

country's naval dominance and

imperial interests since it eased

governance over their colonies.

Thus in a few decades, Britain was successful in their pursuit of establishing a defensive force along the Canal, thanks to the clauses of the Anglo-Egyptian Treaty of 1936.

The Suez Canal's monopoly of trade and travel persisted in the World Wars, acting as a geo-strategic intersection for the allied forces, a conduit of combat and chaos.

Post-war, due to a myriad of economical reasons, Egypt developed an anti-western attitude, opposed to the British garrison of 80,000 at Suez, one of the largest military installations in the world

the boot. Next, the nationalisation of the Canal by Leader **Abdel Nasser** was not well-received by Israel, Britain and France. This triggered an allied attack, dubbed the 'Suez Crisis.' The Soviet Union intervened in support of Egypt, threatening to launch nukes at Western Europe if the coalition didn't leave.

Yet, the retraction of the coalition occurred only after the United States stepped in with the threat to impose economic penalties on all three nations unless the hostility ceased. Significantly, the Suez Crisis was the first instance where the UN peacekeeping force was deployed to oversee the cessation of conflict and the expulsion of the three powers.



Additionally, in the aftermath of the Suez Crisis, Britain and France, once the kingpins of imperialism, witnessed their dominance as superpowers diminish, the United States and the Soviet Union taking their place. Even today the Suez Canal endures as one of the world's **busiest** trade routes, averaging a traffic of around **fifty** ships a day

. The Suez Canal Expansion Project aimed to widen and deepen the canal, allowing for two-way transit and thus expedited travel, expected to become the fastest shipping route between Europe and Asia. This project was imperative because currently, the canal is too narrow to allow traffic to flow in both directions simultaneously. The gravity of the matter was demonstrated on the morning of 23rd March 2021 when the container ship 'Ever Given' incidentally wedged itself across the waterway, blocking the canal for six adverse days. During these days, 369 ships were obstructed, queued to traverse the canal. This delay cost an estimate of \$9.6 billion in trade. Maritime historian Sal Mercogliano said, "Every day the canal is closed, container ships and tankers are not delivering food, fuel and manufactured goods to to Europe and goods are not being exported from Europe to the Far East."

Around \$400 million worth of goods were cut off each hour and Egypt lost about \$12-14 million each day. Even now that it's unblocked, economists predict a domino effect to ripple through the supply chain for several months. When the obstructed container ships rerouted to travel around Africa's Cape of Good Hope to reach their destination instead of the Suez, they were delayed two weeks.

Opportunist Russia took advantage of this to advertise Arctic shipping routes as a shorter alternative to Africa. This suggested Arctic route is banking on the fact that future projections promise the complete depletion of Arctic ice due to global warming by the end of the century. The devious result of this climate crisis would be the relaunching of the Transpolar Sea Route, no longer unsafe and now traversable without requiring an icebreaker vessel. In maritime trade the ships are the arrows, the sea is the bow and the world is the target. Trade is more than just an exchange of goods, it is a medium of purveying power in a multinational game of monopoly.



Whether it's the trade of food & fuel or gold & gadgets, everything is explained by the primal nature to compete over resources, seen in animals and humans alike. We are certainly not precluded from this primitive phenomenon just because our competitiveness is curbed by civility. The Suez Canal of the Egyptian civilization is the oldest geological symbol for our economic evolution, considering how modern trade originated from the sweet & simple barter system and commercial travel found its humble beginnings in the domestication of horses. How one little strait, stretching across a mere 200 kilometres, going out of commission could shake the entire global economy is a sign of fatal fragility, like a house of cards that falls apart in a single blow of the softest breeze.

EQUAL PAYIS FAIR PLAY

The gender pay gap or the gender wage gap, is the average difference between the remuneration for working men and working women. Now, it's customary that women all around the world be paid less than their male counterparts.

As a matter of fact, it is persistent in many developed countries around the globe, hence there is a **significant gap in pay**, between the two genders, as is articulated in the image below.

Although progress has been made in ameliorating women's health and their access to education, the economic gender gap has been much slower in narrowing the gap, with an estimated 250+ years until the world reaches economic gender parity.

One faction which made waves in the world regarding this topic, and who has definitely catalyzed the narrowing of the gender pay gap is the **United States**Women's National soccer team.

Infamously known making headlines for filing a gender discrimination lawsuit against the

Thus, the majority of The United States women's national soccer team players are paid \$100,000 in salaries, plus an additional \$62,500 to \$67,500 for playing in the US Soccer-backed National Women's Soccer League. The women's bonuses have also increased over the years, however the USWNT have made

the legal case that total compensation for the men is higher, even with the salaries the women earn, because the men's bonuses are so much larger.

For example, players on both teams receive win bonuses if the team manages to win an individual qualifying game.

The USWNT win bonus is \$3,000 while the win bonus for the USMNT is \$12,500 for achieving the same feat. Moreover, if the USMNT had won the men's World Cup in 2018, US Soccer would have paid the top male players nearly \$1 million each. In comparison, when the USWNT won the women's World Cup in 2019, US soccer paid \$260,870 at most to each player which is roughly only a quarter of what their male counterparts would earn for doing the same thing. An explanation that has been commonly used to justify the prevalence of this difference in pay, is the disparity in the total revenue earned in Mens and womens' football.



To put it simply, men's football generates more revenue than the women's game and hence they are paid more. However, in the case of the USA, the women's soccer games have generated more revenue than U.S. men's

games over the past few years.




That's according to audited financial statements from the U.S. Soccer Federation (USSF) obtained by The Wall Street Journal. From 2016 to 2018, women's games generated approximately \$50.8 million in revenue, compared with \$49.9 million for men's games. The Journal report notes that the "ability of the women's team to generate gate revenues that equals or exceeds the men's team is an important battleground," and central to an ongoing lawsuit filed against the USSF by 28 members of the U.S. women's national soccer team. If the women's team can generate similar amounts of revenue as the men's team, why can't they be paid the same? In December 2020, the USWNT and U.S. Soccer reached a settlement over one portion of the team's lawsuit, involving unequal working conditions. The settlement alllowed the USWNT to move forward with their appeal over a federal judge's May 2020 ruling in U.S. Soccer's favor over the team's pay discrimination claim.

This gender inequality is also prominent in assortment of other sports, a prime example being basketball. This gender disparity was highlighted during the NCAA March Madness Tournament in the USA. When college Women basketball players began to post photos and videos of how they were provided with insufficient food, less accurate COVID 19 testing and less exercise equipment in the NCAA March Madness Tournament Bubbles than their male counterparts, a sense of collective outrage ensued. The most forceful image showed an entire auditorium converted into a weight room for male basketball players filled with numerous gym equipment. In comparison, their female counterparts got nothing more than a set of dumbbells and a few yoga mats.

This is not a new issue by any stretch of the imagination. When then American President Richard Nixon signed Title IX into law in 1972, the door seemed to open for women's sports as women's athletics programs began to form at colleges and universities. However, institutions were slow to implement changes and schools continually gave women athletic departments much less than the amount given to male athletic departments. Funding disparities have remained into the modern era which lead to the stark contrast in qualities of facilities provided. Earlier this year, ESPN reported that the NCAA budgete nearly twice as much for the 2019 men's basketball tournament as it did for the women's—a \$13.5 million discrepancy.

In June 2020, major changes arrived in the WNBA as salaries, prize pools and bonuses and while this is nowhere near the average NBA player's salary, it is definitely a step in the right decision.



From professional players to politicians all joined in the conversation about gender discrimination in the world of sports, dubbing the videos and photos as 'outrageous' and demanding better facilities and respect for female athletes.

At the end of the day, sports are an entertainment industry just like the showbiz industry and athletes are like movie stars. they both aim to entertain. In my opinion, just like in any showbiz, those athletes that generate the most revenue should be paid the most (just like Leonardo DiCaprio is paid more than an extra). However no matter the amount of money that is brought in by the athlete, they all should be provided the same opportunities and facilities no matter what gender.



Could I live through such Contagious spontaneity? I'm scared of losing to it. It's alluring;


The circumstantial happiness, Is it worth the After-pain?




